\*Persons who cannot or do not want to hike to the Coronado Historic Site, which is mildly strenuous, should make private arrangements to go to the site by private cars. Several people will have cars at Tamaya. We will make a list to sign up with them. People going to the site by car should meet at 1:30 pm at the main (West) door to Tamaya that allows entry to the lobby. To go to the Coronado Historic Site by car takes about 10 minutes over approximately 3 miles of paved road.

\*\* Persons who are going on the hike should appreciate that we are walking over Santa Ana Pueblo land for which we will have a permit to do so issued by Governor Montoya of the Santa Ana Pueblo. We cannot leave any trash or damage the local high desert shrubbery and plant life and cannot disturb or pick up any ancient Native American artifacts like pot shards, etc. that might be on the ground. Comfortable shoes are required. No smoking is permitted. And since this is the wild west of New Mexico and some people have driven to Tamaya, no firearms (even with state issued carry permits or licenses) are allowed on tribal land, which also includes one's car on the parking lots at Tamaya.
